Project Title: The Ridge to River: Project for Environmental Preservation (PEP) in Ravine Poisson

Active Youth Movement (AYM)



Thematic area: Conservation and Environmental Management.

Objective: To address conservation and farming practices by targeting school- aged children (L'Abbeyee SDA Primary School and Bexon Infant & Primary Schools), farmers, and other members of the community through educational programmes, literature-rich inputs, digital media, and a nature trail.

Key Achievements:

- Construction of a footpath, benches and gazebo along the 400m nature trail on a section of forest reserve measuring 4ha.
- Erection of signage depicting the biodiversity of the area.
- Development of the curriculum and materials for teaching Conservation and the link to Disaster Prevention developed. Workshop held for teachers (15) and new material published and disseminated in schools from Grades 1 to 3.
- 120 Coloring books and other child friendly paraphernalia developed and disseminated surrounding the same thematic areas.

Project Objective: Empower the youth for sustainable agriculture through the extension of the Aquaponics Farm at Babonneau Secondary School.

Key Achievements:

- 15 students trained in aquaponics and sustainable farming
- 2 additional aquaponics farming models constructed at the school
- Aquaponics farming is integrated into the school curriculum, providing students with a holistic education on sustainable agriculture.
- Knowledge exchange facilitated between students and the community, fostering collaboration and creating a sense of shared responsibility for local food security.
